Extended Practice

Here's how T2K can further support your students' achievement.



Time To Know's engaging activities can extend learning time for students outside of their regular school day. By connecting to T2K via the internet, students can practice skills, complete assignments and participate in learning games. In addition, T2K's Remote Connect-Extended Practice can increase parent's involvement in their child's learning.

8 Ways to Support Student Achievement Using Remote Connect

- 1. Use student data to plan lessons.** During planning, review your current coverage reports and assessment data to identify your students' needs for additional practice and/or enrichment. Determine the applicable homework/extended practice activity and include it on the T2K digital teaching platform lesson train.
- 2. Modify student groups as often as needed.** Use the grouping feature to move students in and out of the appropriate leveled groups for extended practice assignments.
- 3. Assign skill-based activities.** Students can practice selected skills and activities for 15-20 minutes per subject area 3-4 times a week.
- 4. Utilize the Teacher and Student Folder feature.** By placing work in the class folder, students can access their work from just about anywhere. This enables the teacher to check the students' work from home in order to provide timely feedback.
- 5. Discuss remote connect directions with your students.** Review the remote connect informational sheet with the students and send it home to parents to ensure all students know how to access T2K remotely.
- 6. Unlock your lessons.** Make sure to unlock lessons prior to assigning them so they will be displayed on the students' home page. If the activity is differentiated, be sure every student is assigned to a group.
- 7. Utilize a variety of assignment strategies.** Select the applicable strategy for extended practice and learning.
 - a. Differentiated assignments:** For example use PAL or Time To Connect to provide opportunities for the struggling students. Use Take It Further and Time To Explore as enrichment activities to challenge students.
 - b. Games:** Unlock appropriate games to promote fun opportunities for extra practice and reinforcement in both ELA and Math.
 - c. Lesson Histories:** Students can access their lesson histories to review prior and/or daily lessons.
 - d. Printables:** As an alternative to providing printable handouts open the printables and have students complete the questions in their journals.
 - e. Customize assignments:** Websites and teacher-created materials can be added to the lesson train to provide additional differentiation opportunities, support instruction in various ways, and extend engagement and learning.
- 8. Assess student work.** After students complete the extended practice activities and/or homework, monitor their understanding by reviewing their work. Complete the lesson cycle by using the extended practice data to determine next steps.
